The Eagle Achievement Center worked diligently over the summer to provide New Student Orientation programs for students. revised format incoming The emphasized opportunities for peer interaction, learning Coppin traditions and cheers, and executing all important tasks needed that day. The EAC also executed the Summer Academic Success Academy (SASA) with a nearly 100% increase in participants from 62 in



Summer 2023. Finally, registration efforts for Fall Semester 2023 and strong campus-wide collaborations on pushing registration led to an overall increase in enrollment of 5% and an increase to 74% from 62% the prior year retention rate for first-year cohort students.

The National Association of Historically Black Colleges and Universities Title III Administrators awards annual scholarships to undergraduate students at HBCUs who submit competitive applications. We are pleased to announce two CSU students were awarded this year's highest scholarship! To be eligible, applicants had to adhere to the following:

1. Be enrolled full-time as an undergraduate at a member institution and must have completed at least 15 credit hours

- 4. Have a (minimum) cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale
- 5. Present involvement in campus, community service and other activities
- 6. Submit essay (not exceeding 700 words)
- 7. Provide two (2) Letters of Recommendation
- 8. Furnish high-resolution headshot
- 9. Produce official transcript
